Graduation Awards

Monetary Awards

Scholarships/Bursaries – at each graduation, several awards are given to students who plan to continue their education at a post-secondary institution.

University Entrance Scholarships are awarded automatically by the universities through the application process on the basis of high school marks. Value is set according to a graduated scale, beginning with 80%.

The *Chown Centennial Scholarship* is awarded to the top LC graduate with an average of 85% or higher over five credits in at least four subject areas at gr. 12 level. The student must be enrolled full-time at U of M for the following year.

The *Tom Koop Memorial Award* is given in honour of Tom Koop, an LC Teacher, who passed away in 2004. This award reflects the values that Tom had for his students. The recipient is an LC graduate chosen by the staff who demonstrates improvement and proficiency in academics and contributes positively to school climate. He/she must also have made a commitment to continue their education in a post secondary program. Donated by the staff of LC.

The *Heartwork Homes Trades Award* is awarded to the highest achieving LC graduate enrolled in a post-secondary trades program.

Regional Monetary Awards

The *Hanover Teachers' Association Scholarship* is awarded on the basis of a scholarship test written by two candidates from three rural Hanover schools. Candidates must be enrolled in a post-secondary institution.

The *Hanover Teachers' Association Education Award* is awarded to a Hanover graduate enrolled in a post-secondary institution. A separate application and recommendation by LC staff is required.

Awards not requiring plans for post-secondary education:

The *MLA Volunteers & Community Service Award* is awarded by Mr. Bob Lagasse, the MLA for Dawson Trail, to an LC graduate chosen by the staff who best demonstrates a profound commitment to her/his community through volunteer activity.

The *Landmark Mechanical Top Athletes Awards* are awarded to the top female and male athlete who participated in a number of school teams, intramurals, had a positive contribution in the refereeing, coaching and intramurals, while maintaining a full course load.

The *Paul Warkentin Royal Lepage Music Award* is awarded to an LC graduate chosen by the staff for his/her high level of achievement and significant contribution to the Music Program. The student must be enrolled in a minimum of three courses and demonstrate a commitment to building school community through his/her positive attitude and participation in various music and related events.

The *Kinsmen Volunteerism Award* is awarded to an LC graduate chosen by the staff for his/her high academic standing in the four core subject areas and who exemplifies strong character, positive attitude, and participation in extra-curricular activities both in and out of school.

The *Maple Leaf Foods Citizenship Award* is awarded to an LC graduate chosen by the staff for his/her positive contributions to the well being of LC. The student displays a positive caring attitude toward fellow students and teachers.

The *Landville Drywall Perseverance Award* is awarded to an LC graduate chosen by the staff who has shown significant dedication and commitment to his/her studies, sometimes under adverse circumstances.

The *Ste. Anne Co-op Hardest Working Student Award* is awarded to an LC graduate chosen by the staff for his/her work effort and attitude.

The *Keating Mechanical Environment Award* is awarded to an LC graduate chosen by the staff who has actively demonstrated an interest or concern in the environment and/or sustainability.

The *Chamber of Commerce All Round Student Award* is awarded to a Graduate who has achieved the highest academic standing in the four core subject areas and who exemplifies strong character, positive attitude and participation in school life.

The *Giesbrecht Mechanical Humanities Award* is awarded to an LC graduate who has the highest mark in ELA and Social Studies (minimum 1 ELA, 1 SS).

The *Richardson Pioneer Math Science Award* is awarded to an LC graduate who has the highest mark in Math/Science courses (minimum of 2 Science and 1 Math).

The Niverville Credit Union Top Academic Award is awarded to the top academic LC graduate.

The *Powerland Computers General Proficiency Award* is awarded to an LC graduate chosen by the staff for their contribution to many areas of school life such as sports, drama, music, committees, and to the LC community.

The *Landmark PTA Student Leadership Award* is awarded to an LC graduate as chosen by the staff for his/her leadership in the classroom and in the school.

Recognition Awards:

Merit Awards Certificates recognize achievement of 32 or more credits from gr. 9 to gr. 12.

Laureate Awards Certificates recognize an average of 80% or higher in top 30 credits.

The *Governor General's Bronze Medal* is an award of distinction given to an LC graduate with the highest academic standing in gr. 11 and gr. 12 courses.
