# **Programs Offered**

LANDMARK COLLEGIATE offers a generalized academic program that will prepare students to enter post-secondary institutions such as university or college or to move into the work force upon graduation. All students in the middle years take the same program of study as prescribed by Manitoba Education. Senior students are able to choose among an increasing variety of courses as they move through the grades. Complete details are available in the *Student Registration Handbook*, but a brief summary is presented here.

To meet Manitoba Education's graduation requirements, each senior student must attain a minimum of 30 credits over four years (Grades 9-12). 21.5 credits are compulsory: they are designed to ensure a quality education and represent a range of subject areas as chosen by Manitoba Education and Landmark Collegiate. The remaining courses may be chosen as electives.

Elective courses span a wide range of subjects and are designed to allow students to develop a broader and deeper understanding in an area of their choice, or to branch out into varied topics such as arts, music, business, leadership, etc. Course choices vary by grade, and may not be offered every year.

Students may also earn other credits through distance learning, community service, private music, and cadet training, for more information please contact the guidance counsellor.

### **Course Selection and Course Changes**

Each spring, senior students will select the courses they wish to take the following year. This will be done in consultation with teachers, parents, and guidance counsellor. While making their course selections, students should carefully consider how their choices might impact their future educational and career opportunities. Course selections should be broadly based and at the highest level at which a student is capable of working, so that post-secondary options are not limited.

After the start of the semester, all course changes, additions, or deletions must be made through the Guidance office. Switching or adding courses will only be possible during the first 6 day cycle of the semester. Course deletions may occur at any time, up to the Term 1 and Term 3 parent teacher interview dates. Withdrawal from a course will be subject to review by the guidance counsellor and may involve consultation with parents first. Course withdrawal forms must be picked up at the guidance office, completed and returned with appropriate signatures in place before a withdrawal is accepted.
