• LC staff focused on developing rich learning experiences through variety of pedagogical practices, assessment and reflection, development of the critical competencies, creating authentic and relevant work for students, and providing active learning activities that require high order thinking.

• LC staffed developed a common understanding of the 6 C's for the purpose of consistent teaching and helping students better develop these competencies.

• Noticeable improvement of student development in the critical six competencies as they pursued questions and learning that became relevant to them.

• LC Students participated in a robust extra curricular program. LC had 8 volleyball, 4 basketball, MY and SY badminton baseball and softball teams. 65% of LC students participated in some type of music program.
