Planning Priority #1

Improving student social, academic and intellectual engagement Year-End Accomplishments

- LC staff focused on developing rich learning experiences through variety of pedagogical practices, assessment and reflection, development of the critical competencies, creating authentic and relevant work for students, and providing active learning activities that require high order thinking.
- Noticeable improvement of student development in the critical six competencies as they pursued questions and learning that became relevant to them.
- LC Students participated in a robust extra curricular program. LC had 8 volleyball, 4 basketball, MY and SY badminton baseball and softball teams. 65% of LC students participated in some type of music program.

Improving individual numeracy and literacy skills.

Year-End Accomplishments

- Grade 7 to 9 reading assessments and provincial assessments continue to show that LC students are above average in reading.
- Fast ForWord® program shows students on the program are moving closer to grade level with respect to their reading and concentration skills.
- LC students continue to do well in provincial math assessments.
- Student demonstration of higher level critical thinking skills in math through visualization and communication teaching strategies.

Year-End Accomplishments

- The grade 7 community class **collected held a toy** drive **for the children of** Hull Beach, Nunavut to support the isolated community. Hull Beach has a population 900, 50% of whom are under the age of 18
- Students in Global Issues course engaged in final projects that involved raising awareness (and funds) for an organization that has been set up to help others in our society. Much of this work was not able to be completed due to the cancelation of in school classes in the Spring.
- Grade 11 and 12's students served at Salvation Army and Union Gospel Women's Shelter.
