#### **Year-End Accomplishments**

- Grade 7 to 9 teachers continued to implement most aspects of mRLC Numeracy Achievement Program (NAP).
- Students in grade 7 to 9 improved in mathematical skills as measured by NAP assessments.
- Student report card shows an increase in higher-level critical thinking skills in math and ELA.
- Students in grade 7 and 8 improved reading skills as measured in reading assessments done in September and in June. Most student improved at least one grade level.
- School ELA Teachers participated in 3 mRLC Sessions for developing writing skills. A school writing continuum will be developed over the next couple of years.
