## Planning Priority #1

### Improving student grit and perseverance in mathematical problem solving Year-End Accomplishments

- LC staff continued to focus on developing growth mindset (Carol Dweck) to develop resilience, perseverance, and confidence in Mathematics.
- Students in grade 7 to 9 improved in mathematical skills as measured by NAP assessments.
- Student report cards show an increase in higher-level critical thinking skills in math and ELA.
- Numeracy support provided students with more support in their math courses.
- Ongoing focus on developing fact fluency, estimation skills and algebraic thinking.

## Planning Priority #2

### Developing effective communication skills through improved writing skills.

#### Year-End Accomplishments

- Student writing conventions improved due to teacher focus on writing communication of all students by recognizing, applying and adapting rules and conventions (grammar, spelling, legibility, register, genre, form, elements of design) across all grade levels and subjects.
- Students engaged further in their written responses to teacher feedback.
- Landmark Collegiate staff began developing a school writing continuum.

## Planning Priority #3

### Improve students' sense of belonging so that they feel they are valued members of the school community.

#### Year-End Accomplishments

- Excellent student participation in schoolwide events such as the annual Talent Show and Price is Right.
- Introduction and expansion of clubs and programs for students to participate, coding and chess clubs, and revival of student lead groups such as ISCF and GSA.
- Increased assemblies celebrating student success and learning.
- All grades had one volunteer experience at Salvation Army
- 30 students participated in Gathering of Friends at Roseau River
